Course Evaluation Methods

During the first week of class, students will schedule an individual meeting with the course faculty for an assessment of learning needs. By week 2 of the class students will receive and sign a syllabus addendum containing the individualized course evaluation methods for this course.

Students will be required to remediate clinical skills and demonstrate satisfactory performance. A grade of satisfactory must be received for clinical skills performance or a grade of "F" will be assigned for the course.

Grading Scale

Once a satisfactory clinical rating is received the course grade will be determined using the following grading scale:
