Objectives were met fully: in FY 2015 – 16 Reflection tables were created to better review student suggestions from their reflection papers of program outcomes. This table was used to improve student attainment of the objective and gives the students an opportunity to offer faculty feedback on ways that the SON may help them with the program goal. In addition, faculty initiated having the students use a Likert rating system to further evaluate this objective in the Spring of 2016. These worked very well and were used with all program goals.

Goals FY 2016-17:

Graduates from the MSN program will demonstrate effective communication.

Outcome was fully met. Students clearly indicated that they had opportunities to grow and improve in this program outcome. There was a statistically significant increase in their self-ratings from program entry to completion. The only suggestion that students made was to include more group projects and to give writing samples for major papers.

Graduates from the MSN program will improve healthcare outcomes of their clients.

Outcome was fully met. Outcome was fully met this year as it was two years ago. Assessment will continue year after next to see if other items are identified that by the students. There was a statistically significant increase in their self-ratings from program entry to completion. Students suggested having more information about EBP use in the clinical setting. These changes will be made and the outcome will be re-evaluated in two years.

Graduates from the MSN program will demonstrate advanced leadership and management principles.

Outcome was fully met. Results indicated that students were fully meeting expectations on this outcome as they were two years ago. In addition, students did not indicate that the SON needed to do anything to help them achieve this outcome except to offer them even more group projects. No real changes are indicated at this time but assessment will continue year after next for comparison.

Graduates from the MSN program will use legal and ethical professional standards.

Similar to two year ago, this goal was fully met. Students were rated by their faculty on obtainment of this outcome during their clinical rotations. All faculty rated 100% of the students as on track or above average on this objective. Student reflections indicated that 100% of the students rated themselves as having obtained this outcome and, when asked what else the SON could do to help future students obtain this outcome, a suggestion was made to have class discussion in each class so that the students could work through and discuss an ethical solutions. The FNP faculty thought this was a great suggestion and plans are to increase these opportunities regarding ethical, medical problems which may be faced by the FNP students.

Graduates from the MSN program will provide compassionate and coordinated care.

This outcome was fully met again this year. The students were rated by their faculty as being on track or above in communicating in a professional manner utilizing culturally sensitive and ethical approach. The students rated themselves as all having obtained the objective and offered few suggestions on how we as a school could help them

obtain this outcome in the future. This outcome will be evaluated again in two years to determine if changes are needed.

Students' ranking of their communications skills prior to starting our MSN program and after completing the program was tested in this analysis. Because the post test score was not normally distributed, a Wilcoxin Signed Ranks test was used to test for differences. An examination of the changes in score rankings at the beginning of the program and at the end of the MSN program indicated that the students' reported a statistically significant increase in their communication skills (Z=3.62, p<.001)

Students' ranking of their progress on this program outcome at the start of our MSN program and after completing the program was tested in this analysis. Because the post test score was not normally distributed, a Wilcoxin Signed Ranks test was used to test for differences. Similar to two year ago, this goal was fully met. Students were rated by their faculty on obtainment of this outcome during their clinical rotations. All faculty rated 100% of the students as on track or above average on this objective. Student reflections indicated that 100% of the students rated themselves as having obtained this outcome and, when asked what else the SON could do to help future students obtain this outcome, a suggestion was made to have class discussion in each class so that the students could work through and discuss an ethical solutions. The FNP faculty thought this was a great suggestion and plans are to increase these opportunities regarding ethical, medical problems which may be faced by the FNP students.
