Good morning!

I've gotten a good bit of feedback from my cohort. Overall, everyone likes the idea of a virtual pinning and appreciates the sentiment of it. There were a few questions and concerns:

Will we still have a pinning ceremony before commencement once we are able to have it? A few people expressed being more excited for the pinning ceremony than actual graduation.

A handful of our cohort is not at home with their families, and some are in their Milledgeville homes without roommates. For some that are home, their parents are still having to go to work at essential businesses and may not be able to physically pin them. They are all interested in a virtual ceremony but I do think these are some points to keep in mind as we try to accommodate everyone.

Someone made a point that Zoom or WebEx will likely lag with so many people on a "conference call". To combat this, I think it would be helpful to have anyone who joins that is not student or faculty keep their microphone and camera off.

Even if not everyone has someone to pin them, I think the most important/best part would be showing the slideshow via screen share and announcing each of our plans after graduation so we can celebrate each other. If we are hoping to have an in person ceremony in the future, we could choose to go more the celebration-route rather than the ceremony-route. We could all dress up or dress in scrubs, have each name and future plan read and cheered for, have instructors speak if they want, possibly have a toast at the end. I know this is more casual than what a pinning ceremony would typically be, but as we well know by now, life is very atypical right now:)
